Letter from the

BOARD PRESIDENT & CEO

Dear Friends,

To say that 2021 was a year of challenges would be an understatement! But we are proud to say that **Boys & Girls Clubs of Huntington Valley has stood up to every challenge and met them head on.** This is possible through extraordinary levels of partnership and support from donors and volunteers who believe in our mission, dedicated staff members who never give up, and strong leadership from our Board of Directors. **Thanks to the incredible combined efforts of our supporters and staff, the Club has always stayed open** and continues to provide vital support to the children and families who need us most.

Looking back over the last year, there have been so many changes. We started the year during a pandemic surge. Schools were closed, but we stayed open, providing a place for children to learn, stay connected to friends, and have caring staff guide them through their virtual school journey. As the pandemic continued, children transitioned to hybrid learning models. Again, we met the needs of families. The Club provided virtual learning labs as well as bus service to and from school on the days when children were on school campuses. What a lifesaver we have been to our working families who had no way to manage online learning and multiple trips to and from the school campus.

At our preschools, joy could be found every day! Children were loved by our staff, engaged in educational activities, played, learned, had fun, and were provided the safest care possible while their parents worked. Our preschools provide the tools so that children can enter Kindergarten with all skills necessary to be successful. Among the 300+ children ages 6 weeks to 6 years old, we were proud to graduate 33 children from our TK programs who started Kindergarten well prepared in their home districts this fall.

In addition to providing childcare services, we also continued to provide creative outlets for children

in our dance, theater, music, voice, martial arts and sports leagues, including arena soccer, basketball, and volleyball. Our motto has been, and will continue to be, **"Whatever It Takes to Build Great Futures."** We take that seriously and understand that during a time of so much stress and anxiety over the unknown, it is important to provide children opportunities to discover, have fun, and just be kids. It wasn't always easy, but **we continue to be creative, adaptive, and innovative in providing opportunities for children while always focusing on safety and health.**

Working so hard to provide for families has come at a great cost. Keeping children in small, dedicated cohorts for almost two years now has significantly increased our expenses. To put it simply, our operational costs are greater than our revenue. Our talented, committed Board of Directors have used their expertise, influence, and personal gifts to help provide the funding and encouragement necessary to continue to meet the challenges we face daily. We are so thankful for their willingness to lead and provide resources to our families.

We are also grateful to YOU for doing all you can for the kids. **Your support has kept us going during this turbulent time.** You have made a positive impact on so many families and made so many children smile! Your encouragement, support, and contributions make all the difference as we continue to meet the needs of the families in our community. **We are looking forward to an incredible 2022 and hope you will join us as we do Whatever It Takes to Build Great Futures TOGETHER!**



SCHOOL AGE PROGRAMS

Providing Safe Spaces for Children to Learn and Grow

When parents were asked what they love about the Boys & Girls Club, there were so many different answers. Everyone had a reason to love the Club!

- "The staff love my kids."
- "My kids are always happy to go there and they leave happy, too!"
- "It's a safe environment - they are COVID-ready."
- "Bus pickup and homework help."
- "They're open on most days that schools are off."
- "It's affordable AND great quality."
- "My kids always come home learning new things."
- "I love how much my kids love going to Boys & Girls Club!"

The Club's motto is "Whatever It Takes to Build Great Futures." And that's exactly the approach our school age Clubs take every day. We don't just do one thing. We do so many things! This year, after two pandemic school years, **making sure children have the support they need to succeed in school is one of our biggest priorities.** Our fleet of **18 school buses** transport hundreds of children to and from 40+ schools everyday. Once kids arrive at the Club, they participate in hours of enrichment programs. Kids get homework help, access to WiFi, and can explore a brand new STEM lab with Chromebooks and 3D printers. Programs like Data Detectives, Imagine Science, Power Hour, Breakout EDU, ST Math, Lego Engineers and reading programs engage youth and build skills to help kids stay on track academically and reach their potential.

During summer, we offered full days of enrichment programming from 7:00am – 6:00pm. Since we couldn't take kids on field trips, we brought those experiences to the Club. Hands-on learning with groups like the Bolsa Chica Wetlands and Mobile Ed Productions and activities like obstacle courses, rock climbing, and even making donuts kept kids learning, growing and having fun throughout the summer.

Social emotional learning and FUN are a big part of every day at the Club. As we navigate through the pandemic, it's extremely important to teach kids to work together, play together, and just have some fun being kids – playing in the gym, cooking in the teaching kitchen, digging in our community garden, building Legos, or hanging upside down on the playground.

The Club's biggest responsibility is **keeping kids safe.** That can mean a lot of things. Keeping kids physically safe in our Clubs. Providing a safe haven for kids who have a difficult home environment. Giving kids a place they feel free to be themselves. Keeping kids as healthy as possible in the middle of a pandemic. These are all part of the layers of protection that the Club provides for kids. We're their safety net.

Every day at the Club, and every activity that the kids participate in, our goal is to provide each child a safe space, the opportunity to learn, and to build positive relationships with their peers, all while receiving support from caring staff. With those key elements of a good childhood infused into every moment at the Club, we know that all those small moments will be the foundation for something big – **A GREAT FUTURE!**



PRESCHOOLS PROVIDE CARE AND STABILITY

Parents and Kids Benefit from Childcare They Can Count On

"What I love about the Boys & Girls Club is the security and consistency it provides our children in this ever-changing world. It gives peace of mind to working parents like me." Those words from a Club parent show just how important it is that the Club has kept its doors open for the families who need us throughout the pandemic. Moms, dads, caregivers and kids all know that they can always count on the Boys & Girls Club and its caring staff.

Within the Club's stable environment, children at the Club's two preschools flourish and lay the foundation for their great futures. It all starts with staff who treat kids with the loving care they deserve, always with a goal of helping children fulfill their own potential. With **children ages six weeks old to six years old** attending our Learning Center and Robert Mayer Child Development Preschools, that can look different for every child.

A staff member named Liliana shares how focusing on children's individual needs can make a big difference

to kids. "I noticed that one of the children in our classroom, Siana, had a hard time communicating her needs with the teachers. Whenever she was getting frustrated while playing or whenever she needed something, she would just cry. I started encouraging her to use her words to communicate her needs. At first, it was a challenge for her. But with practice and continued support, now, she uses her words almost all of the time. I wanted to help her because I could see that sometimes simple things would make her frustration escalate and end in a tantrum. Her communication skills are improving a lot and now she's having an easier time talking with staff, making friends, and playing with her classmates."

With staff members focused on each child's needs using patience, kindness, and consistency, children are developing the everyday skills that lay the foundation for children's success in school and in life.





CLUBHOUSE ACADEMY & SPORTS LEAGUES

*Building Skills and Giving Kids
a Second Home*

ClubHouse Academy offers more than 50 classes every week in **dance, acting, music, and karate** and offers year-round opportunities for youth to join in sports leagues like **basketball, arena soccer, and volleyball**. Throughout the pandemic, the opportunity for kids to participate in fun outlets like these helps give back a sense of normalcy to their lives and adds a big infusion of FUN to every week. Youth have the opportunity to increase their skills, compete, make friends, and let go of all their worries when they are part of ClubHouse programs.

15-year-old Maddy says, "I've been dancing with ClubHouse Academy for



7 years. I joined the studio when I had just moved here from across the country. Not only did ClubHouse Academy provide a space for me to learn and grow in my dancing, it also gave me a safe space where I was surrounded by so many wonderful people. The teachers were always so kind to me and I met so many new friends. After just a few months, **ClubHouse Academy already felt like a second home to me.**

With everything going on in the past year for me, from the pandemic to starting high school, it's been pretty hectic. **It's really comforting to know that I always have a place**

where I can just let go of all of the negativity in my life.

My teachers at ClubHouse Academy are so supportive of me in every path I take. Whether it be trying something new, auditioning for something that might be scary for me, or really anything! They always **push me to be my very best** in classes and that's the reason I've become the dancer I am and they've helped me grow in such amazing ways. I wouldn't be where I am now if it weren't for the wonderful people at ClubHouse Academy."





HELPING FAMILIES

Community Partnerships Help Meet Critical Needs

Helping kids and families is what the Boys & Girls Club is all about. Over the last year, the Club has pushed harder than ever to make sure that families who have been struggling due to the pandemic get the support that they need. We know that there are a lot of needs that extend beyond outstanding youth programs. Thanks to many community partners, the Club is able to connect kids and families with the resources they need.

One of the most basic needs for families is nutrition. **1 in 7 children in Orange County is experiencing food insecurity.** That means they don't know where their next meal is coming from. But, thanks to the Club's community partners, **no child ever had to go hungry at the Boys & Girls Club.**

- Grocery Outlet Fountain Valley partnered with the Club for their "Independence From Hunger" celebration in July, providing weekly groceries for families and food for our teaching kitchens throughout the summer.
- Second Harvest Food Bank provided a nutritious meal for every child at our Oak View Branch every day.

- Caterina's Club provided a pasta meal for every child at our Haynes Family Huntington Beach Branch, Kingston Fountain Valley Branch, and Pacific Life Foundation Branch every day.
- A grant from Orange County's District 2 and the American Rescue Plan Act provided \$50,000 in grocery store gift cards that the Club was able to distribute to families.

Thanks to partnerships with the Boys & Girls Clubs of California Alliance, the State of California, Fountain Valley Regional Hospital, and Walgreens, the Club was able to help meet families' health needs, too. The Club provided **COVID-19 vaccines** for youth ages 5-11 and childcare providers, including our staff, to help protect kids and the whole community. Hosting clinics at our Clubs, families were able to access vaccines in a convenient, easy way, breaking down any barriers to service.

Clothes that fit, school supplies to help children learn, and toys to spark children's imaginations are all important needs for kids, too. Kids received clothing essentials, shoes, pajamas, holiday gifts, and more

thanks to partnerships with Surf City Rotary Club, Kiwanis Club of Fountain Valley, Kiwanis Club of Huntington Beach, Coldwell Banker/Campbell Realtors, Fountain Valley Fire Department, Angels Tree Project, Karen Wolff and the SeaCliff Neighbors and many more supporters.

Year after year, these groups share their generosity and their hearts with the kids at the Club so every child's needs are met.

OAK VIEW BRANCH HELPS KIDS SUCCEED IN SCHOOL


Youth Get the Support They Need to Fulfill Their Potential

After multiple disrupted school years, kids in our community and around the country have been struggling academically. The challenges have been especially great for children like the kids at our Oak View Branch. Their struggles go beyond the everyday challenges of the pandemic that we all face. **1 in 4 children in the Oak View community are homeless and nearly all qualify for free and reduced-priced lunches.** They had limited home access to technology and internet service during online learning. Their families speak a language other than English at home, which makes it hard for parents to help with school work. **Thanks to donors like you, the Club is able to help give kids the support they need to move from struggling to succeeding.**

Throughout the pandemic, the Club's staff have worked hard to ensure that every child has what they need to succeed in school. A staff member named Amanda shares her story about working with Katie at the Oak View Branch. "Katie has been in my group since last year and I have been able to create a great relationship with her and she knows that she can trust me. When she first came into my group, she was falling behind in school and was very guarded. Over time, I helped her catch up in her school work and she became so

motivated that she actually started getting ahead in her work. Once she was all caught up in school, she was more confident in her ability to succeed in school and has **shown extreme progress in her academic ability.** Throughout this year, I have given her small responsibilities within our group and that has allowed her to grow as a leader and feel important. She now enjoys being very involved in all that we do and has a great desire to succeed in all that she does. I feel extremely lucky to be a part of her life and be someone that she knows cares about her."

SCHOLARSHIPS HELP FAMILIES WHEN THEY NEED IT MOST

was consistently late for about four weeks. I spoke to his dad and asked that simple question – 'Is everything okay?'. That's when he shared that he is a **single dad who just recently got full custody** of his son. He is trying his best to raise his son on his own. He said that he **lost his job and had been doing his best to make ends meet**, but it's been a struggle. I shared his situation with our Director and she helped him with our scholarship program application. Carson's dad was very thankful and he qualified for a 50% discount on his son's tuition rate. He has voiced his appreciation for our help many times as he gets back on his feet financially, and he is extremely appreciative for all the ways that our programs are helping Carson grow and learn."



New Facility Fund Named in Honor of Tanya and Bob Hoxsie

After 40 years of service, Tanya Hoxsie retired from her position as the Club's Chief Executive Officer in May of 2021. To honor her extraordinary service to the community's youth and her husband **Bob Hoxsie's dedication to the organization as a board member of 30+ year's**, the Club named the new **Hoxsie Family Facility Fund** in their honor. The fund was created to help with the cost of maintaining and repairing our seven buildings and our school bus fleet.

The Club chose to honor them in this special way because the Hoxsies have helped create and maintain each of the Club's

seven facilities and helped build our transportation program, from buying our very first bus to building a fleet of 18 buses. Their commitment to giving kids the very best places to learn, play, and grow is inspirational!

Funds raised through the Hoxsie Family Facility Fund will help the Club's school bus fleet keep up with the latest CARB emission mandates required to keep all of our buses on the road and serving the families who need the Club the most. 


